


EXPLORE

HISTORY





OUR STORY

Guild House is a relatively new hotel ... but we're also a hotel with a long history.

Our story begins back in 1882, when a group of bold, forward-thinking women formed a club called the New Century Guild to support the growing number of working women in the city. (At the time, women working outside the home was still a deeply controversial prospect.) From the outset, the women of the Guild were an impressive, progressive group that included abolitionists, suffragists, activists, artists, writers and more.

In 1906, the Guild, now more than 1,000 members strong, bought the elegant Victorian manse at 1307 Locust Street to use as their headquarters — the same property that today holds our Guild House Hotel. For more than a century, this stately four-story rowhome was a hub of education, activism and camaraderie for women who were out in the world making history.

Today, our Guild House has been lovingly refurbished and brought into modern times, and yet every aspect of the hotel pays tribute to the historic women of the New Century Guild. Each guest room contains the individual stories of these remarkable characters — women who navigated, fought for and represented a changing America, right here at 1307 Locust Street.
